### Because of You

Since starting in December of 2016, PPAR has taken in 148 dogs and has had 101 adoptions. We have also taken in over 180 cats and have adopted out 115. We certainly cannot forget the two rabbits and two guinea pigs that were in our care and have found forever homes. These numbers

change on a daily basis due to adoptions and intakes.

Among these, we've had dogs with severe skins issues, one heartworm positive, another with a congenital heart defect, some deaf, blind, missing an eye and several emergency trips to Cornell. Kittens with severe eye infections, feline leukemia, one hermaphrodite and six litters of bottle babies.

We've taken in animals that we knew had very limited time left. Many tears have been shed over animals we just met. We've held, cried and helped some over the rainbow bridge, but in the end we would not change a thing.

It has become quite common to receive emergency phone calls and make late night runs to help an animal in need.

Throughout all of this, we have met some wonderful people in our community, have had the pleasure of working with and building relationships with other

work with us, and of course we cannot forget to mention the wonderful groomers!

Without all of you, this could not be possible. It is only because of you and your support that we have been able to help so many animals in need. We cannot say "thank you" enough to everyone who supports us and our mission.

We look forward to what the future holds for us. Remember... we are ALWAYS in need of foster homes for dogs and cats. Without foster homes, we would not be able to help all these animals in need.
